Up front, a stylish set of Mean Street 56mm work damn well together. inverted forks, black of course, runs a three degree ower stock rake, while bum comfort is assured with Fournales shock absorbers doing their usual first class job at the rear. Rolling duties up front are courtesy of a spoked wheel measuring some 21in x 3.5in with gloss black rim, matte black spokes and hub. And a DNA rotor rotates, until the Hawe Halters International (HHI) caliper clamps down on it at the rider's command.
